

## BIRD NEST FEEDERS

Time: 20 minutes

Create pouches full of soft nesting materials for birds to use when making nests!



Materials:
Burlap
Twine
Yarn
Cattail Fluff
Lint
Moss

In North America, birds begin building their nests in the spring. Birds weave their nests together using a variety of different materials. Some birds will camouflage their nests using mud, lichen, and moss to protect young from predators. Use the materials list as a guide for your bird nest feeder, but add dog fur, horse hair, and any other materials a bird may enjoy to your feeder!



First, cut a piece of burlap that is approximately 9x7 in. Fold the piece of burlap in half and staple the sides, leaving the top open.



Weave a piece of twine on either side of the open top to make a strap.



Fill your pouch
with soft
nesting
materials such
as: yarn, cattail
fluff, lint,
moss, horse
hair, dog/cat
fur, etc.



Hang your bird nest feeder outside for your neighborhood birds to enjoy!
